Hi Helga,

Thanks for our phone discussion earlier, regarding a grant to maintain Kuranui Colleges' CDMP car. The vehicle is supplied by the Wairarapa Road Safety Council and kept at the College to assist students in gaining their restricted drivers licences, prior to exiting college.

These students are identified by careers teachers as being marginalised, and not otherwise having access to safe vehicles or licenced driving 'coaches'. These students usually leave college with nil licence, which is required by 70 percent of employers.

Kuranui have been marvellous in supporting the programme, and have had great outcomes, with students passing their restricted licences enabling them to move into employment, or indeed tertiary education.

As I understand our conversation, the Trust views any grant application to assist Kuranui College, would be viewed through the education funding lens, and the College would be expected to allocate vehicle maintenance funds from any annual funding grant to them from the Trust.

The next annual education trust funding to the college would be considered from September 2019, for use in 2020.

I hope I have that right.

Attached is our CDMP 'dossier', which gives an overview of this very worthwhile programme.

The outcomes I see are not only from an education perspective, but for the students using the programme, to open up employment opportunities, and also becoming safe responsible local road users, which would encompass community outcomes as well?

If this is accepted, then is there a different funding thread that could be used from Greytown Trust to be used as a direct funding tool for the CDMP vehicle?

Please contact myself in the first instance for any further information, or Di Banks, being the CDMP lead in Kuranui College.
